- Class size is a concern.

Phone Survey cont.

- Perceptions to address; spending effectively/efficiently, spending referendum funds wisely, tax increase should be last resort.
- 51% believe financial management is good or excellent.
- Reason for not supporting last referendum; spending, cost, taxes.
- What people would support; safety and security, technology infrastructure, Community Education space, converting schools.
- Other questions addressed the best ways to communicate with residence.

Options to Consider

Option 1A:

- New grades 9-12 High School for 1,100 students (75% utilization)
- Existing Middle School becomes grades 3-
- Existing High School becomes grades 6-8
- Prairie Elementary a K-2 and partial ECSE/PK

Estimated cost: \$68,158,308

Option 1B:

- New grades 9-12 High School for 1,100 students (85% utilization)
- Existing Middle School becomes grades 3-
- Existing High School becomes grades 6-8
- Prairie Elementary grades K-2 and partial ECSE/PK

Estimated cost: \$65,801,013

Option 2:

- Existing High School grades 9-12 with addition to reach 1,100 students
- Existing Middle School grades 6-8 for 900 students
- Prairie Elementary grades K-2 and partial ECSE/PK
- New grades 3-5 intermediate building for 900 students

Estimated cost: \$71,395,988

Option 3:

- Existing High School grades 9-12 with addition to reach 1,100 students
- Existing Middle School grades 3-5 for 900 students
- Prairie Elementary grades K-2 and partial ECSE/PK
- New Middle School grades 6-8 for 900 students

Estimated cost: \$77,222,419

Option 4-Additions:

Existing High School grades 9-12 for 1,100 students	\$26,422,250
Existing Middle School grades 5-8 for 1,200 students	\$19,888,650
Prairie Elementary grades PK-4 plus Early Childhood	\$26,321,500
Est. Total Cost	\$71,637,429
