I. PURPOSE

- E. Any student, parent or guardian having a question regarding this policy should discuss it with the appropriate school district official as provided by policy. In the absence of a specific designee, an inquiry or a complaint should be referred to the superintendent.

IV. GRIEVANCE PROCEEDUES AND RIGHTS

- C. In the event of disagreement with the school district's investigation and response the grievant has a right to request an impartial hearing with legal counsel.
- D. Grievant has the right to appeal the impartial hearing officer's decision.
