This could include pants, shirts, dresses, skirts, etc. but it must be items permitted through the school dress code. Black jeans are accepted if they are very black and not oversized. Please wear black shoes (or if your student does not have black shoes, they can wear the darkest nicest shoes they have). Remember to use your ISD518 Activity Passes for admission to our concerts. If you don't have a pass, the cost is Adults \$6, Students \$4.
