- 1. The meeting was called to order by each chair, Commissioner Demuth, Mayor VonHoldt and Board Chair Lorenz.
- 2. Motion by Commissioner Justin Ahlers, seconded by Commissioner Gene Metz and unanimously passed to approve the agenda for the November 29, 2023, Special School Board ice arena discussion meeting.

- 5. Mr. Landgaard reviewed the objective of the meeting and gave an overview of the different options along with budgeting information for an addition to the existing ice arena facility, reconstructing a shell over the existing facility or the option of building a new facility.

Mr. Johnson gave an overview of the existing ice arena. The arena has been in operation for 33 years and the refrigeration system was only expected to last 20 years so its 13 years past its life expectancy. Numerous repairs have been made to the facility to date. It would take an estimated \$5 million to limp the existing facility along for another series of life.

The boards discussed the idea of building a new facility and how much revenue it would generate for the community. The boards discussed the idea of building something grander and using the facility for other events. Also discussed was how each board would fund their portion of the cost of a new facility and where the new facility would be located.

It was ultimately decided that all entities meet separately to decide if they are willing to move forward with the idea of a new facility and for how much and to come back with a recommendation at a joint meeting after the first of the year.
