Worthington District 518 EARLY CHILDHOOD SCREENING

Do you have a child that is 2-5 years old? Has your child been to early childhood screening? If not, read on...

Minnesota State Law requires that children age 3 1/2 - 4 years participate in a developmental early childhood screening. This screening is free. The purpose of the screening is to identify children who may benefit from district and community resources that are available to help in their development.



The screening will consist of the following components: fine/gross motor skills, language development, concepts, height/weight, vision, hearing, review of child's health history, and immunization record (these are not substitutes for comprehensive exams).

District 518 will be sending out letters of invitation to children who are in the appropriate age range. If your child is 4 years of age and has not been screened or if you would like to check if your child is listed on our census, contact Melanie Kuhl, Early Childhood Screening Coordinator at (507) 727-1207 for more information. 





The school year has moved quickly, with winter weather arriving soon. We have simplified some of the terminology for days students will not be at school because of the weather and possibly having adjustments to the normal school day. You will get notification of an "Alternative Learning" day for your student. This notification can come in a variety of ways such as an email, call, text, school social media post, and on local radio or television stations. An "Alternative Learning" day will be announced the night before or right away in the morning so parents can make plans for their student, and everyone will know what to expect of the learning day. We encourage you to ask questions if you do not understand and, in this catalog, we have included a chart that will help you with the different terms and plans for each possible situation. Please also use the student management system (CAMPUS, See Saw, Schoology) for specific information. If you as a parent or student have not signed up for the notifications, or have changed phone numbers, please contact your child's school building to give the correct information. We would like to thank all of you for helping to ensure we can continue our education even when this may be from home.

The EDGE (Enrichment Directed towards Gaining and Extending knowledge) after school program for students in grades kindergarten through 8th grade has helped our students work on their math and reading skills. EDGE also helps with social and emotional skill building for students that need that additional guidance. The number of students might increase after parent teacher conferences, testing, or a student is having frustrations in the classroom as the year progresses. EDGE is offered after school and during summer school for District 518 students.

The availability of credit recovery and night school has been beneficial to many of our high school students from WHS and the Learning Center. Our VIBE (Virtual Instruction by Excellence), an online program has students from around Minnesota participating in classes from home. These programs will help in working with students to keep them on track in the classroom and towards graduation.



Our District 518 staff has worked hard this year on many fronts to provide innovative teaching lessons, assignments, and projects for our students. We appreciate their efforts to adapt and be flexible in working on many levels to keep kids learning and doing well in the classroom.




