



Our population in the Worthington area has continued to grow for over two decades. Along with the population growth in the area and the five communities that make up District 518, we continue to have a growing district. This is a welcome opportunity rather than having concerns about declining enrollment and having to make budget trimming and cuts in our district. Along with growth comes the concerns about having enough classroom space throughout our district.

Over a decade ago, we put before the voters of the district the need for a new high school to allow for enough classrooms for our students to help alleviate class room sizes, expand the band room to accommodate a large band and have enough storage space for the music department's needs, renovate the kitchen and servery area that serves over 1,100 students twice a day, expand the cafeteria space to have enough seating space to serve the students, renovate the media center to provide additional workspaces for our growing IT department to better support students and staff, and more in a referendum that failed. Since that time, we have added two new additions to the high school to provide more classrooms, but we continue to need more space for our growing student population and the services that are provided to them each day. We focused our attention over the past few years to help alleviate space issues that were going on within our younger students and their classrooms and space issues. Building the Learning Center, Community Education, and the Intermediate School has helped move our students into facilities that are giving them enough space to learn and explore in becoming successful citizens in the future. But the concerns for high school space upgrades and renovations remained on the list.

Your district school board has continued to address the facility needs, listened to the suggestions and feedback from staff to gather information, and is prioritizing the building improvements that best meet the needs for our district long-term. They have been discussing these improvements and have moved in the direction of putting together a building bond referendum that will be put before our voters on Tuesday, August 13. More information is included in this publication and more information will be forthcoming to address the list of improvements to the high school that are being addressed. Please feel free to contact your school board members and administration about your questions or concerns.



We are winding down a busy and productive school year with many end of the year events – awards, field trips, Prom, concerts, graduations and more. District 518 has had a successful year of being honored with special recognition of its staff and community. These recognitions are wonderful accolades for staff that work hard to provide excellence in and around the classroom. Please join us in appreciating their efforts for our students, families, and communities that we represent.







A SINGLE-QUESTION PLAN TO IMPROVE WORTHINGTON HIGH SCHOOL

If voters approve the referendum on August 13, the \$15.3 million investment will fund approximately 45% of the total proposed improvements:

- Build a new two-story, eight-classroom addition to address capacity needs.
- Renovate and reconfigure existing classroom space to support programming needs.
- Renovate and expand the kitchen and servery area and reconfigure and expand the cooler/ freezer/dry storage space.
- Renovate the existing office and student services area into a student commons and dining
 area to address capacity needs, and connect the east and west sides of the building on the
 second level.
- Relocate the administrative offices and student services area to the north main entrance of the building to improve overall building security and provide better access to specialists.
- Renovate a portion of the media center to provide additional workspace for the district's IT department to better support students and staff.
- Improve several restrooms to be single-stall, ADA-accessible privacy restrooms.
- Expand the equipment and storage area to support CTE programs.
- Address critical LTFM needs, upgrade various finishes, replace built-in items, and replace several
 areas of the existing roof.
- Complete fixtures, furnishings, equipment, and technology upgrades in renovated spaces.

LEARN ABOUT THE COST OF THE PLAN

If the referendum is approved, the district would invest a total of \$33.8 million in high school improvements – \$15.3 million funded through the building bond referendum and \$18.5 million funded through other district funds.

Ultimately, the school board's commitment of these funds lowers the overall tax impact of the building bond referendum to district taxpayers. A \$200,000 residential home would see a tax increase of \$4.68 per month for 20 years starting in 2026.



Ag2School credits would pay for approximately 33% of the referendum's total debt service payments, equivalent to approximately \$5 million. This state-funded credit reduces the contribution percentage for agricultural landowners to slightly less than residential landowners.


