District 518 Community Education recently celebrated its 50th Anniversary. To commemorate this milestone, we held open houses on November 14 because it was National Community Education Day. Thank you to everyone who came out to celebrate with us!

Over the last 50 years Community Education has changed and grown significantly. District 518 Community Education started out with one part-time employee who planned and opened the buildings for enrichment classes. Now we have about 75 regularly scheduled staff members and many additional casual/part-time staff. Five distinct departments offer extensive and varied programs for people of all ages. Our programs are designed to meet the unique needs and opportunities of our local school district and area. Turn to the inside back cover of this brochure to see a few photos from the last 50 years.

This winter we are offering a variety of new classes. Brenda Oberloh will be teaching a class on how to make Kringla in December. Marlen Balster is offering four creative arts classes for youth on days that school is not in session.

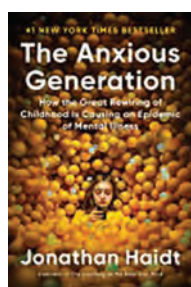

SCHOOL READINESS PRESCHOOL AT DISTRICT 518 COMMUNITY EDUCATION

Application period for next year begins on February 10, 2025.

Slots will be filled on a first come, first served basis.

- School year is similar to ISD 518 K-12 school dates
- School schedule is Monday-Friday, 8:45 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.
- Child must be 4 years old by September 1, 2025, must live in District 518 and must be daytime potty-trained by the start of school.
- Preschool slots will be awarded and families notified by March 20, 2025.
- If your child obtains a slot, you will be contacted to complete the enrollment paperwork.



Early Childhood Screening

Do you have a child that is 3-5 years old?
Has your child been to early childhood screening? If not, read on...



Minnesota State Law requires that children age 3 1/2 - 4 years participate in a developmental early childhood screening. This screening is free. The purpose of the screening is to identify children who may benefit from district and community resources that are available to help in their development.

The screening will consist of the following components: fine/gross motor skills, language development, concepts, height/weight, vision, hearing, review of child's health history, and immunization record (these are not substitutes for comprehensive exams).

District 518 will be sending out letters of invitation to children who are in the appropriate age range. If your child is 4 years of age and has not been screened or if you would like to check if your child is listed on our census, contact Melanie Kuhl, Early Childhood Screening Coordinator at (507) 727-1207 for more information. CULTURALLY RESPONSIVE EDUCATION: INTEGRATING CREATIVITY, LITERACY, AND SPECIAL EDUCATION

In this course, taught by two professors of education at Southwest Minnesota State University, educators will explore innovative and culturally responsive methods for integrating math, literacy, and creative arts instruction, with a special focus on the inclusion of special education strategies. Through a series of interactive sessions and final implementation projects, participants will learn how to apply Hip Hop Literacy, arts-based learning, and comprehensive math routines in ways that foster diversity, equity, and inclusion in their classrooms. 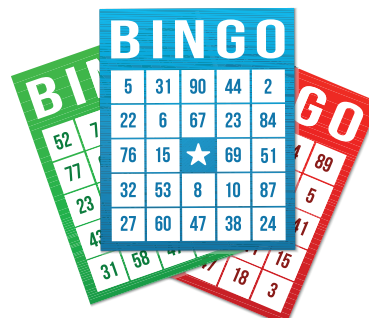

A "Learn from Home" day will be announced the night before or right away in the morning so parents can make plans for their student and everyone will know what to expect of the learning day. We encourage you to ask questions if you do not understand and in this catalog we have included a chart that will help you with the different terms and plans for each possible situation. Please also use the student management system (CAMPUS, See Saw, Schoology) for specific information. It is also important that we have your correct phone number or email to receive notifications. We would like to thank all of you for helping to ensure we can continue education even when this may be from home.

The EDGE (Enrichment Directed towards Gaining and Extending knowledge) after school program for students in grades kindergarten through 8th grade has helped our students work on their math and reading skills. EDGE also helps with social and emotional skill building for students that needs that additional guidance. The number of students might increase after parent teacher conferences, testing, or a student is having frustrations in the classroom as the year progresses. EDGE is offered after school and during summer school for District 518 students.

We also offer the availability of credit recovery and night school to the benefit of our high school students from WHS and the Learning Center. Our VIBE (Virtual Instruction by Excellence), an online program has students from around Minnesota participating in classes from home. These programs will help in working with students to keep them on track in the classroom and towards graduation.

WORTHINGTON DISTRICT 518 HAS BEGUN THE SEARCH FOR ITS NEW SUPERINTENDENT

The District 518 School Board is currently conducting a search for a new superintendent as a result of John Landgaard's retirement. The School Board contracted with the Minnesota School Boards Association (MSBA) to guide and provide assistance throughout the process.

The Board met with MSBA on August 29 in a work session and September 18 for a special board meeting to discuss the superintendent search process. An important part of the search process is gathering input for the Board to consider as it moves forward in selecting the next superintendent. The board's unanimous decision to select MSBA was made at its September 18 special board meeting.

November 25, 2024 – January 12, 2025 – MSBA posts opening on local, regional, and national websites, advertises position vacancy and receives applications.

January 13, - February 3, 2025 – School Board members review applications.

February 3, 2025 – School Board meets to determine finalists, interview questions and procedures.

February 7, 2025 – School Board conducts first round of interviews with candidates.

February 10, 2025 – School Board conducts reference checks and holds second round of interviews; Board selects lone finalists and sets negotiations process.

February 11, 2025 – School Board designee begins negotiations of employment contract with lone finalist.

February 18, 2025 – School Board meets to approve employment contract (regular School Board meeting).

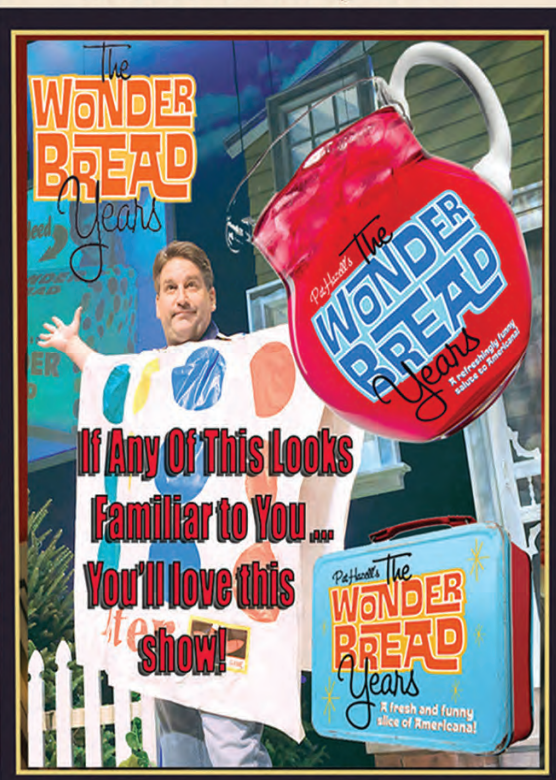

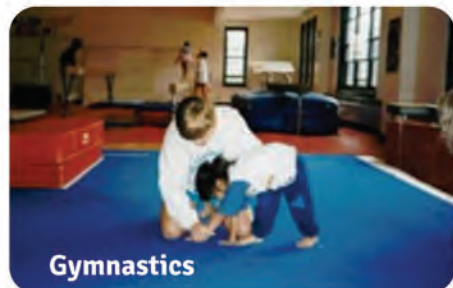

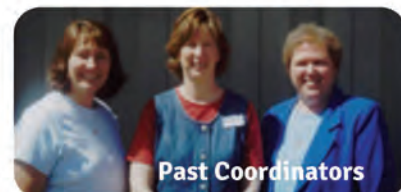
