



### COMMUNITY EDUCATION YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Worthington District 518 Community Education offers youth scholarships to enable more youth to participate in program offerings. As with most other school district activities, Community Education uses the USDA Free and Reduced Lunch application data to determine whether or not local youth are eligible. Children who qualify for Free or Reduced Lunch, will be able to enroll in most Community Education youth activities for the reduced fee.

To obtain these program scholarships, families should indicate their interest in applying for the reduced fee when enrolling their children in a Community Education class or activity. The Enrichment Programs Coordinator will determine whether any additional information is needed to determine if the child qualifies for this income-based program. 



Over the past several months, I've had the privilege of sitting down with students, staff, families, and community members across Worthington to listen and learn. During this time, nine different listening sessions were conducted as I began learning about District 518. As a new superintendent, I believe the best way to understand a system is through conversation. These discussions allowed for honest feedback about what we value, what we do well, and where we can grow.

Throughout the process of our listening sessions, a picture of District 518 became clear to me. This picture was outlined by care, collaboration, and community pride. Whether I was visiting with the staff of one of our schools, chatting with students, or simply being among a learning community, one truth stood out. People here care about kids.

At the heart of the messages I heard was a shared belief in relationships. Staff and students emphasized that strong relationships built on trust, respect, and communication, are the foundation for success. Teachers and support staff spoke about knowing each student by name and by need. Students shared how much it means when adults take time to check in, listen, and show they care.

Our learning communities also take great pride in their diversity. Worthington Schools are a community where students, staff and families bring a world of perspectives and backgrounds into our classrooms. Our educators recognize this diversity as one of our greatest strengths and are committed to ensuring that every student feels included, supported, and challenged.

Equally important is a focus on opportunity. Staff shared how they strive to make sure that every learner has access to high-quality academics, arts, and athletics. From an array of educational activities and electives to expanding access to career, post-secondary, and technical programs, our schools are providing more pathways than ever for students to find success.

Another theme that became prominent as we spoke from building to building was teamwork. Teachers, paraprofessionals, counselors, and administrators work together daily to meet students where they are. Our staff have embraced collaboration through a co-teaching model, participation in professional learning communities, and through flexible scheduling. This collective effort reflects a commitment to ensuring every student is supported by a caring team.

Of course, our conversations also highlighted areas that need continued attention. Mental health support remains a pressing concern. As needs grow, so must our capacity to provide services for students of all ages and all needs. We also heard a call for continued improvement to facilities. This included a desire to update spaces for music and the arts, enhancing technology access, increasing safety protocols, and ensuring our learning spaces support modern 21st century learning.

As we began each of the individual listening opportunities, I shared with staff and students that these would not be a one-time event. The insights gathered will help guide our needs assessment and, ultimately, a full strategic planning process. Together, we'll define the goals and priorities that will shape how District 518 continues to provide great opportunities for our learners. I look forward to more opportunities with our learning communities in the future.



The good news is I can confidently say that we are starting from a place of strength. This district is grounded in relationships and driven by the value that every student deserves to succeed. Our goal now is to align resources, strengthen communication, and build systems that ensure our successes are sustainable.

As your new superintendent, I am honored to serve this incredible community. I will continue to listen, learn, and lead alongside our staff. I believe in this because our students and families deserve our very best.
