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




CENSUS INFORMATION NEEDED

Are you new to the community and have young children? Was your baby born someplace other than Worthington? Do you have new neighbors with young children? We need your help! ECFE funding depends upon having accurate information about the children, ages birth to kindergarten who reside in our school district. Please call our office at 507-727-1225 so we can add the child's name to our census data. Being in the census ensures that you will receive Early Childhood Family Education mailing, be notified for Early Childhood Screening, and receive preschool and kindergarten information when your child becomes eligible to attend.



Early Childhood Screening

**Do you have a child that is 3-5 years old?
Has your child been to early childhood screening? If not, read on...**



Minnesota State Law requires that children age 3 1/2 - 4 years participate in a developmental early childhood screening. This screening is free. The purpose of the screening is to identify children who may benefit from district and community resources that are available to help in their development.

The screening will consist of the following components: fine/gross motor skills, language development, concepts, height/weight, vision, hearing, review of child's health history, and immunization record (these are not substitutes for comprehensive exams).

District 518 will be sending out letters of invitation to children who are in the appropriate age range. *If your child is 4 years of age and has not been screened or if you would like to check if your child is listed on our census, contact Melanie Kuhl, Early Childhood Screening Coordinator at (507) 727-1207 for more information. 

Worthington District 518 COMMUNITY EDUCATION YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Worthington District 518 Community Education offers youth scholarships to enable more youth to participate in program offerings. As with most other school district activities, Community Education uses the USDA Free and Reduced Lunch application data to determine whether or not local youth are eligible. Children who qualify for Free or Reduced Lunch, will be able to enroll in most Community Education youth activities for the reduced fee.

To obtain these program scholarships, families should indicate their interest in applying for the reduced fee when enrolling their children in a Community Education class or activity. The Enrichment Programs Coordinator will determine whether any additional information is needed to determine if the child qualifies for this income-based program. 



Preparing for Whats Next

I have found that one of the best parts of working in Worthington is the opportunity to sit down with people from across the community and simply talk about our schools. This includes what's working, what could be better, and how we keep moving forward together. That's exactly the purpose of our quarterly Trojan Morning Meet-Ups. These are a series of informal conversations designed to bring school staff, families, and community partners together around shared topics.

We recently hosted our second Trojan Morning Meet-Up of the school year. This meeting brought together representatives from our local organizations, city and county leaders, parents, and district staff. The conversation focused on two main topics. These topics were secondary student registration and how families and the community receive school information.

With registration for the 2026-27 school year getting underway at our high school soon, we spent time talking through how the process works and how families can best support students. Registration is a guided process that helps students map out required courses, electives, and credit totals. Within the registration process, a conversation for mainly juniors and seniors is held regarding postsecondary credit options. These opportunities allow students to get exposed to college coursework and the school district very much values our partnership with Minnesota West to provide these opportunities. Our high school advisory teachers and counselors play a key role in helping students and families decide what makes sense, and more information will be shared as the actual registration date gets closer.

The second part of the morning was spent talking about communication, specifically the school district's website and how people engage with it and use it. As we prepare to move toward a new website and a companion mobile app, we asked one question. When you go to a school website, what are you looking for and how easy is it to find?

The answers were consistent. People want quick access to calendars, activities and sports schedules, staff contact information, lunch menus, and weather or emergency updates. Attendees also shared the need for stronger language translation, easier access to Infinite Campus (our student information system), lunch accounts, and a mobile-friendly design with clear buttons on the home page. Community members reminded us that our website isn't just for parents, it's also for employers, families new to Worthington, and anyone trying to understand what our schools offer.

When it comes to receiving information, one message came through loud and clear. Many participants shared that texts are the fastest and most reliable way to reach them, especially for weather updates, schedule changes, or urgent information. Phone calls were also preferred for emergencies, while social media and email remain helpful for general updates.
