## CENSUS INFORMATION NEEDED

Are you new to the community and have young children? Was your baby born someplace other than Worthington? Do you have new neighbors with young children? We need your help! ECFE funding depends upon having accurate information about the children, ages birth to kindergarten who reside in our school district. Please call our office at 507-727-1225 so we can add the child's name to our census data. Being in the census ensures that you will receive Early Childhood Family Education mailing, be notified for Early Childhood Screening, and receive preschool and kindergarten information when your child becomes eligible to attend.

## Worthington District 518 COMMUNITY EDUCATION YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Worthington District 518 Community Education offers youth scholarships to enable more youth to participate in program offerings. As with most other school district activities, Community Education uses the USDA Free and Reduced Lunch application data to determine whether or not local youth are eligible. Children who qualify for Free or Reduced Lunch, will be able to enroll in most Community Education youth activities for the reduced fee.

To obtain these program scholarships, families should indicate their interest in applying for the reduced fee when enrolling their children in a Community Education class or activity. The Enrichment Programs Coordinator will determine whether any additional information is needed to determine if the child qualifies for this income-based program. 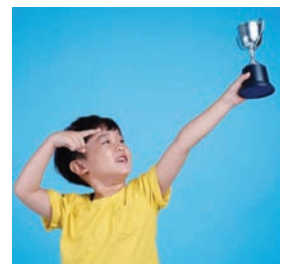

# GROW YOUR OWN EDUCATOR SCHOLARSHIPS - THREE OPPORTUNITIES AVAILABLE LOCALLY

## 1. Southwest Teacher Preparation Partnership

Southwest Teacher Preparation Partnership: This grant is a partnership between District 518, Minnesota West Community & Technical College and Southwest Minnesota State University that awards scholarships to individuals who live in or work for District 518, who are pursuing a teaching degree in Early Childhood, Elementary Education, or Teacher of English Language Learners (TESL). Recipients must attend Minnesota West then transfer to SMSU.



## 2. Early Childhood Educator

This grant is available to individuals who live in or work for a Nobles County Integration Collaborative school district and are pursuing an initial teaching credential in Early Childhood Education. These scholarships may be used toward an Early Childhood certificate or an Early Childhood birth to third-grade degree.

## 3. Diverse Teachers

This grant is open to individuals living in the Nobles County Integration Collaborative area. Scholarships will primarily be awarded to Persons of Color and American Indian applicants pursuing an initial teaching degree at a Minnesota college or university. Additional applicants will be considered if they are pursuing a degree in a high-need field of teaching and are enrolled in an approved teacher education program.

Although these scholarships each have slightly different focuses, all Minnesota Grow Your Own grants prioritize awarding scholarships to racially and ethnically diverse candidates to develop a teaching workforce that is more reflective of the students in Minnesota.***

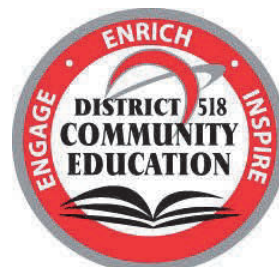

# HERITAGE CENTER: IMMIGRATION EXHIBIT ON DISPLAY AT THE COUNTY'S HERITAGE CENTER



Earlier this year, the Nobles County Historical Society (NCHS) celebrated the opening of its first permanent exhibit at the Nobles County Heritage Center. Titled “Nobles County: A Second Home For Immigrants,” the exhibit had been in development for more than four years and represents a major milestone for the organization.

The exhibit explores the history of the immigration of Nobles County, from early settlement-era pioneers to more recent newcomers. It highlights how individuals from around the world have made a home in the county and contributed to its growth and development over the past 154 years. Through compelling and humanizing storytelling, visitors can connect with these experiences by viewing personal artifacts immigrants brought with them and by listening to firsthand accounts shared through interactive video stations. Additional hands-on activities are included throughout the display to engage both children and adults.

The exhibit is organized around six universal themes that reflect the shared migration experience across generations: “Leaving Home,” “The Journey,” “Building Community,” “Generations of Change,” “Welcome and Unwelcome,” and “Immigration and the Law.” Whether immigrants arrived in 1886 or 2026, these themes illustrate the common challenges and triumphs of starting a new life.

The opening of this exhibition follows NCHS’s relocation approximately four years ago to Worthington’s former National Guard Armory. After completing a successful \$4 million capital campaign, the Society fully rehabilitated the historic structure to meet its programming needs. As part of this transition, the museum was rebranded as the Nobles County Heritage Center.

Today, the Heritage Center serves as a hub for preserving and interpreting local history. Its expansive exhibit hall allows NCHS to showcase how people and events have shaped Nobles County over time. As the lead permanent exhibit, “Nobles County: A Second Home For Immigrants” is expected to remain on display for at least the next decade.

The Nobles County Heritage Center is located at 225 Ninth Street in Worthington, directly across from Worthington City Hall. It is open Tuesday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., and admission to the exhibit is free.

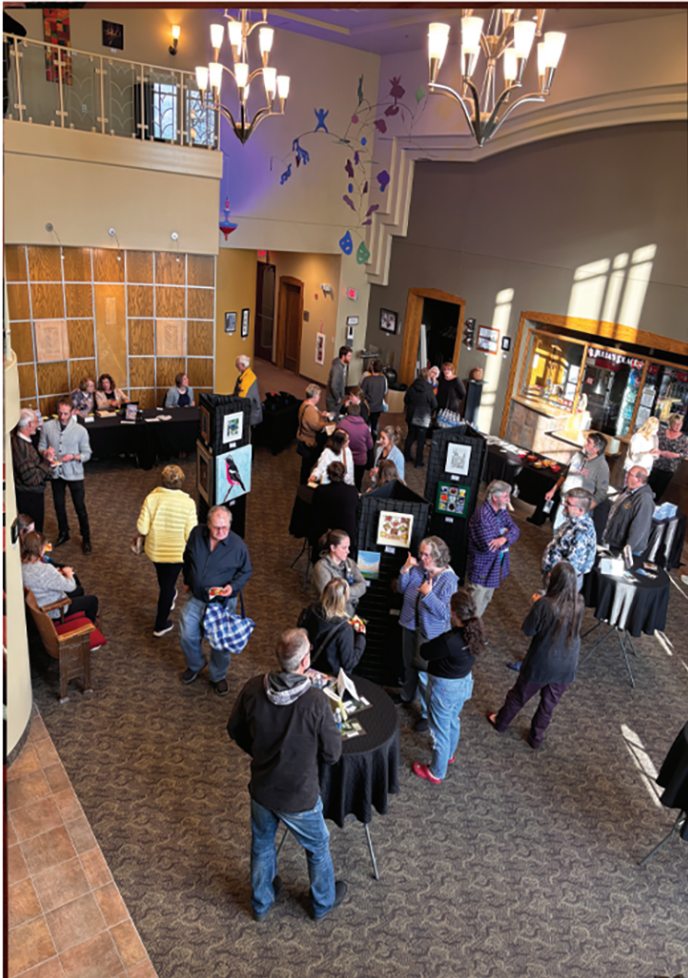

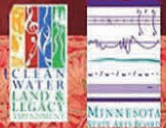

These are practices that I have always found valuable, both personally and professionally.

First, and most importantly, this is a time for celebration and recognition. The work of an educator can be a grind, just like any other profession. When I say educator, I mean that in the broadest sense. It includes everyone who works within our schools. Teachers, paraprofessionals, clerical staff, custodial staff, interpreters, nutritional staff, administrators, and the many, many others that all play a role in teaching each day. That teaching may not always happen in a classroom, but every member of the Trojan Team who walks through our doors each day does so with our students in mind.

The days can blend together and move quickly. That is why it is so important to pause and recognize the hard work, growth, and learning that have taken place throughout the year. The staff at District 518 are committed to providing meaningful learning experiences for our students. # Construction Projects for District 518 Summer 2026



## WHS Main Gym Renovation

The high school gym will undergo a major renovation beginning right after graduation, with work continuing into the 2026 – 27 school year.

Upgrades include new Tectum ceiling and wall panels for improved acoustics, appearance, and LED lighting. Six large 12-foot ceiling fans will replace the old ones, providing better airflow even at low speeds. The gym walls will be repainted, and recently refinished floors will be carefully protected during construction.

Additionally, the secondary basketball courts will be reoriented perpendicular to the main court and resized to junior high regulation, allowing two games to be played simultaneously. During construction, teams plan to practice at Minnesota West and Prairie Elementary.

## Trojan Softball Field

District 518 and the City of Worthington are planning a new softball complex on the former Tower Street site between Clary and 11th Streets, with construction expected to begin around May 18 pending state permits.

The complex will feature a mix of specialized turf types: a green soy-based turf in the outfield (the first of its kind in Minnesota), a denser brown turf for the infield, and even more durable, replaceable turf in high-wear areas like the batter's box and pitching mound. Compared to the turf at Trojan Field, this design uses shorter, thinner fibers and requires less rubber infill, reducing maintenance needs and heat buildup.

The completed facility will include a varsity field along with bleachers, a press box, batting cages, bullpens, concessions, restrooms, parking, and additional natural grass fields.
